### Welcome to our 20th Member Bulletin.

In this Bulletin we cover affiliation & insurance cover; May production; volunteer teams; and more.

#### **AFFILIATION & INSURANCE**

We are now officially a part of the Macclesfield Community Association (a Task Group) following a resolution at the MCA committee meeting of 17 May 2021. I think this further demonstrates endorsement by the local community of our objectives and recognition of the community service we provide. It also serves to clarify our cover for volunteer insurance and public liability insurance under the terms of the Mount Barker District Council insurance policies taken out on behalf of the MCA and other community groups. Notwithstanding this we have also taken out separate volunteer insurance cover in our name through AON Insurance.

### **MAY PRODUCTION**

Biochar production in May was 2160 litres. Carbon captured was 288 kg. CO<sub>2</sub> avoided was 925 kg. Electricity offset was 2.2 MWHrs.

### **TOTAL PRODUCTION SUMMARY**

The latest summary of our production and carbon capture as at 30 May 2021 is shown below based on: Dry bulk density of our biochar = 189 kg/m<sup>3</sup>.

Carbon content of our biochar = 84.3%.

SA emissions factor = 0.43 kgCO<sub>2</sub>/kWhr.
