Production Update:

Biochar production to date this season so far is 1580 litres, representing a carbon drawdown of about 0.6 tonne of carbon dioxide from the atmosphere.

So why not take advantage of your membership discount and buy a few bags to keep you going with your gardening and composting chores? And why not try biochar in some more unusual ways eg Deodorising smelly bins and cupboards; absorbing moisture run-off from early morning condensation on windows etc; water filtration; soil stabilisation etc etc.

BIOCHAR & pH - WHAT DO THE EXPERTS SAY?

One of the benefits of biochar that you often see claimed is that it increases soil pH when added to the soil. While this may be an advantage in some highly acidic soils it could also be a disadvantage in some highly alkaline soils. But what application rate would typically be needed to raise the soil pH by say 1 unit? And over what period of time will this take? And for what period of time will the increase apply? These are all questions that I think need to be clarified once and for all so I will be investigating this topic in the coming weeks and hope to have some answers for you then.
